## PREFACE

In tracing your family genealogy I feel almost like I have become personally acquainted with your ancestors because I have been able to find out so much about them. Your family lines have been very interesting. Your ancestors have had many different occupations, lived in many places in Canada, Virginia, Penn., Illinois, and St Louis and adjacent areas. Some of your ancestors were well to do while others had to struggle for a living.

The ancestor that totally swept me up for some time was your illustrious Captain Joseph LaBarge. Even as you were eager to learn more about him I found his adventures and companions fascinating! What a sturdy, courageous man he was! His convictions and integrity ran deep.

Your people served in the civil war, war of 1812 and War of Independence. They were Lutherans and Catholics mainly in religion. The reason many were so good to trace is that they could be found in the records of the churches that they attended. Church records are among the very best of sources in getting good first hand information about families in doing genealogy. Your ancestors were devout members of their faiths and frequent church goers in Canada, Illinois, Virginia, and St. Louis, Missouri. If we could have had more church records in Virginia and Penn. some of our unanswered questions would have been solved. Some church records in Virginia during the earliest years were partially destroyed or not kept so that handicapped us some there. Other church records were not kept early enough on some of the frontiers in early Virginia.

An effort was made to search completely as possible all available records in areas where your ancestors lived. If the records were at the Utah Genealogy Society library the records there were searched. If the records were somewhere else I endeavored through correspondence to obtain the necessary information. Local libraries in the areas where your ancestors lived were contacted and valuable suggestions and information was obtained from the St. Louis public Library and the Handley Library in Winchester, Virginia. The LaBarge Papers at the St. Charles Historical Society Library in Missouri were obtained and studied.

Parties who were doing research on similiar lines to yours off the Lauck line were contacted and information was shared. I appreciate very much the information shared by Armand P. LaBarge of Ontario, Canada on your LaBarge problem which helped us in tracing the line back into Canada and France. The sharing of The sharing of materials with Mrs. Arlene L. Wake helped in breaking the problems on the ancestry of Lewis M. Lauck to his parents and grandpartents and their families. We were fortunate in finding such helpful relatives. To name everyone that helped with this research would take more time than I probably should in making this preface. Everyone that helped is greatly appreciated.

It is hoped that this genealogical and historical data on your family will be of interest to you now and in the years to come. That you will remember the good times that we have had in tracing your family genealogy.
