being well and in perfect health and sound in my Reason  
and know that is appointed for all men one to die I do  
publish pronounce and declare this to be my last will and  
testament principally and first of all I give I bequeath  
my soul to God that gave it and my body to be decently  
buried Item I give to my well beloved wife Mary her  
bed and table, a chair and wheels and what flax &  
wool we have on or about the house and the one half of  
the corn and one half of the meash and one pound and  
six pounes lawfull money at my decease.

Item. I give to my well beloved son Alexander Morison  
one third of my Real & personal Estate and one third  
part of my debts due to me and to pay one third part  
of the debt that I owe, and I order the former of my  
decease to be sold the better to enable them to pay said  
debt thus given to him & his heirs forever and two pounes  
to be paid by Alexander to my wife Mary.

Item. I give unto my well beloved son John Morison two  
thirds of my Real and personal Estate and two thirds  
of my debt due to me, and two third part of the  
Debt that I owe, and four pounes to be paid to Mary  
my wife by my son John Morison.

Item. I give unto the Children of my well beloved son William  
Morison do. eight pounes lawfull money four pounes  
to be paid to his son Robert and one pounes six shillings  
eight pence to his son William and to his sons Alexander  
and James one pounes six shillings eight pence each,  
and I order my daughter Katherine my Law Chest  
of Drawes and one haifer, and further I order  
Thomas Hendrey of Bridgewater to be the Sole Executor  
of my last will and Testament signed & sealed in  
in presence of us.
