Know Ye, That whereas, Margaret Morrison

late of the County of Cook and State of Illinois, died on or about the twelfth day of August 1876, as it is said, after having duly made and published her

last will and testament, a copy whereof is hereunto annexed, leaving at the time of her death property in this State, which may be lost, destroyed, or diminished in value, if speedy care be not taken of the same; and inasmuch as it appears that

John O'Laughlin

has been appointed executor in and by the said last will and testament to execute the same, and to the end that the said property may be preserved for those who shall appear to have a legal right or interest therein, and that the said will may be executed according to the request of said testatrix

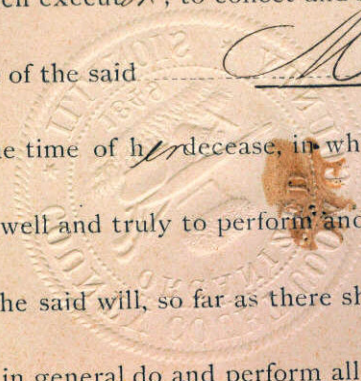
we do hereby authorize him the said John O'Laughlin


First. - It is my will that my funeral expenses and all my just debts be fully paid.
